Clerk/Treasurer Munoz stated that our assessments increased by \$28,000 this year. A 2% increase would have been \$8,000, so this caused us to go \$20,000 over the tax cap. This will give us a little extra income, but does require us to override the tax cap.

Trustee Conner had some ideas for the Village's 150th celebration: Farmers Market, craft market, booths for various community groups, Chinese auction for fundraising, food trucks, BBQ, opening the Samuel de Champlain museum. Mayor McFetridge thought sometime around Sept. 23rd. Trustee Herzog suggested making the Cornhole tournament on River Street a part of the celebrations. We should have the 2 playground pieces installed and the volleyball net set up. Discussion followed. We are looking for community input.

Discussion on NYS Housing Compact Proposal and if it has been approved. We are waiting to hear NYCOM's opinion on this matter.

Trustee Trombley provided the board with a copy of the new Logo to be used on the website that the Town has been working on.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT: January 2023

Water:

- West Service Rd water tank was approved from CCHD and is back online
- We excavated and capped both sides of a 10" water main on Walnut Street.
- Monthly interim water readings was completed
- We read water meters 2 extra times to try to identify any leaks in homes or unoccupied buildings.
- On 2/4 50,000 gallons of water was drawn from the fire station for the Weathercock fire in Chazy.
- On 2/5 @ 3:16 am, the alarm dialer showed low water in the tank. the source of the leak was located at 5:00 a.m. Owner in charge of building was notified.

Sewer

- Contractors working on UV disinfection project are on hold until spring at the WWTP
- We were able to Jet and remove blockage in a plugged sewer main that was backing up.

Equipment:

- 2010 Peterbilt has a fuel line leak. All lines are corroded and in bad shape. New parts are ordered.
- 2021 Peterbilt seems to be low on powere when plowing. Peterbilt is going to reprogram transmission to see if this helps. The vibrator stopped working on the sander box and a new circuit breaker ordered.
- Removed flat tire on loader, had it repaired and it is back in service.
- Changed cutting edge on the loader.

Streets:

- Plowing and sanding as needed
- Moved and hauled away snow

Mixed sand and salt

Misc./To Do

- Ditched a spot along Rec trail to keep water off, but still have a lot of work to do.
- Installed new light at the salt shed.
