# Village of Champlain Village Board Meeting October 17, 2022

A Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Champlain was held on Monday, October 17, 2022 at the Village Office, 11104 Route 9, Champlain, New York.

## MEETING CALLED TO ORDER & ROLL CALL

Mayor McFetridge called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Present were Mayor McFetridge, Trustees Kim Trombley, Nicci Molinski, Charles Conner & Joel Herzog, Clerk/Treasurer Munoz and Codes Officer Matott. Also present were James Ondras, Monique Lepage, David Lepage and Holly Visconti.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Trustee Conner, seconded by Trustee Molinski to approve the minutes of the September 12<sup>th</sup> Regular Board Meeting. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

# PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS, COMMUNICATIONS AND GENERAL QUESTION PERIOD FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY

Monique Lepage was asking the status of having a pickle ball court in the Village. She is aware that it would require a certain type of surface that can drain. Mayor McFetridge said that we would need money to fund that type of surface as it is very expensive. Possibly a grant from the Health Dept. There is space available in the playground area.

Ms. Lepage asked if student signatures would help in getting funding. Mayor McFetridge agreed that a petition and statement of support of a Pickle Ball court in the Village of Champlain would help. We just don't know where the funding would come from. Students could get signatures over the winter and they could come from anyone in the school district area, students and adults.

She asked about the stumps in the children's garden area. Was anything done to decorate them?

Nicci Molinski said that the plan was to paint something on the stumps.

Ms. Lepage said that maybe members of the National Honor Society could create designs over the winter.

Mayor McFetridge added that students could also get involved with painting the water tank base.

Ms. Lepage asked about the ice rink. Per Jim Ondras, we are unsure because it is very weather dependent. She asked about other activities that the NHS could help out with.

Mayor McFetridge mentioned Trunk or Treat on Oct. 29<sup>th</sup> at 2 p.m. if anyone wants to decorate a vehicle and hand out candy. Trustee Molinski will reach out to them about Christmas activities they can help with.

## REPORT FROM CODES ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Code Enforcement Officer Matott provided the board with a report for September.

The Codes Enforcement Officer reported that the Dept of State Section 1203 mandates that all towns adopt a local law that says we can enforce the NYS Uniform Code. We can add to make it more stringent but cannot take away from the minimum standards. It must be adopted by Dec. 31st. The Codes Officer drew up the new local law and shared it with the mayor and our lawyer, Tom Murnane. He asked that, if the board would like to see any changes making our code more stringent, such as penalties for violations and the fee schedule, to contact him. This would be the time to make those changes. Mayor McFetridge will send a copy of the Local Law to the board members for their review.

Codes Officer Matott has tried to contact the owner of the burned out house that is being demolished downtown. He would like to see the exterior cleaned up and the building closed up before winter.

911 Address changes are mainly on West Service Rd, where the numbers don't line up with the properties. The Fire Dept. will make new address signs for those properties.

Mayor McFetridge reported the following:

We will be picking up brush that last week of October. If you have bagged leaves, please call the office with your address. We have a local citizen who will pick them up.

Recreational campfires and fire pits are no longer allowed. There is no burning in the Village per Village code.

Mayor McFetridge congratulated Woody Kissel on his retirement after 29 years. He held many positions in the Village during his time here. We welcome Kevin Sterling who was hired as the Water and Wastewater Plant operator & will be in training for those positions.

Truck or Treat will be held on Oct. 29th at 2:00 p.m. at the playground.

The Holiday Fest is scheduled for December 10th

The Village board of trustees reviewed the report of unpaid taxes compared to the original tax roll and submitted their signed Certificates of Unpaid Taxes.

## 7. Easement for Mike Thibodeau

Mr. Thibodeau wanted to purchase land behind his property on Main Street so that his tenants could exit onto Maiden Lane instead of Main Street. Per FEMA's buyout of this property, we are not able to sell the property, but could grant him an easement. Discussion followed. Mayor McFetridge will contact our attorney to draw up a contract to grant an easement that includes details on our liability.

## 8. Sale of Village Property

We have received an offer to purchase property on Perry Mills Road for \$10,000.00.

Our attorney lawyer has spoken with the Attorney General's Office. The Attorney General has reached out to the gas company but has had no response. Our lawyer has said that he will be negotiating this matter.

#### 3. Water/Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator

We have hired Tina Gardner to come in two times a week and is working with Robert Pulsifer & Kevin Sterling. She has the IIA license. Robert will be doing weekend rounds.

## 4. Water theft from hydrants

We are waiting to hear from the Town on proposed fines and penalties.

#### 5. Land Donation from Manny Coupal

Due to lack of knowledge, the legal paperwork was not filed and the property was never transferred to the Village. Mr. Coupal would like to have the Village reimburse them for the tax bill, do the legal paperwork for the transfer of property, and our attorney has recommended that we do a Title Search. This would cost approximately \$900.00.We have already accepted the property from the Coupals, but did not have information on these costs at the time. Discussion followed.
