CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT: AUGUST 2023

- Tenant requested inspection at 157 South St. Trailer is infested with fleas and has multiple property maintenance violations. Letter sent to landlord to have repairs made prior to renting again.
- Email to Curtis Labarge regarding grass/weeds at 11138 Route 9.
- Follow up inspection of Buildings 1-4 at Northern Tier Way. Violations fixed.
- Report of burning on Cedar Street. Told to get permit.
- Court case for 11137 Rt. 9 regarding violations for trash on porch. Violation dismissed as it was cleaned up.
- Re-inspection of 11137 Rt. 9: house is still unfit for human occupancy, but areas that needed to be cleaned in order to have water service turned on, have been. Once water is restored, they can clean further.
- Final inspection of 6 Cane St. CO issued for occupancy.
- Issued permit for above ground pool at 11109 Rt. 9.
- Approval of electrical service being brought inside at the sewer plant instead of disconnect being placed on the outside of the building. This was confirmed with the electrical inspector.
- Issued permit for deck on Moore St.
- Email to Curtis Labarge regarding grass on 11138 Rt. 9. Given 15 days.
- Messages to owner of burned property on Rt. 9 to clean up debris and appliances. Given 15 days.
- Question from Moore St. resident regarding codes pertaining to drone use. No code exists in Village.
- Inspection for possible mold on Cane St. Nothing found during inspection.
- Issued permit for slab at 25 Meadow lane.
- Foster care inspection on Oak Street. No issues found. Letter sent to County.
- Questions on demo and construction in the DMU. Advised to build to flood specifications.
- Conversation with CPS regarding living conditions inside 11137 Rt. 9 that caused it to be condemned.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT: JULY 2023

Water:

- Hydrant flushing completed
- Started repairing issues on hydrants that were found during flushing
- Completed the maintenance and pressure balancing on all 7 main PRV vaults.
- Repaired 4 PRV's that had failed.
- We had 2 water main breaks on 8/24 and 9/8 at the Rt. 9/Willow St. intersection.
- Completed water meter readings for billing with many high readings. There were issues with broken or chewed wires and changed out 10 radios that had failed.

Sewer:

- The sludge drying beds are 98% completed, but Supt. Jolicoeur is concerned that we won't be able to use our loader in drying beds without damaging the asphalt. We may have to purchase alternate equipment.
- The old press was removed and prep work is in progress to install the new press.
- We need to install a new lift station control panel on Main Street and on Paquette Blvd. waiting on quotes.

<u>Equipment:</u>

- We need to install a power disconnect on the 2000 International per Insurance Company.
- The 2010 Peterbilt is having some electrical issues and will need to go to the shop.
- The backhoe parts and new tires will be installed as time allows.

Streets:

- We had a few trees fall due to wet foliage and still have trimming to do.
- Cleaned up debris from storm drains and added stone to areas washed out from storms.

<u>MISC</u>

• Mowing and trimming has been difficult with rainy weather and heavy workload.

- 3 of us attended a hydrant and valve training put on by American Flow Control.
- Salt and sand were mixed and piled in the salt shed.
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WORK TO BE DONE

- We must repair or replace a DI and culvert on Elm/Walnut Street intersection and replace asphalt.
- We must complete some other asphalt patch work before the plant closes for the season.
- Continue with hydrant repairs.
- Sign installation at playground before 150th birthday celebration.
- Install solar panel on Church St. radar sign and repair Prospect St. radar sign.
- Continue with culvert installation and replacement on Oak St. and Prospect St.
- Continue with sign replacement.
- Lift Station control replacements.
- Bus shelter installation
- Bike path ditching
- EJP Presentation about Kamstrup water meters (tonight).
